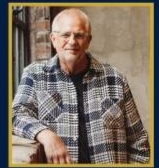

DEVOTIONAL

“Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; He will never leave you or forsake you.” Deuteronomy 31:6

Wow! Fifty years! That is a long time since 1974 and a lot has happened with many of us, to many of us, and through many of us over the past 50 years. The Bible verse above immediately took hold in my thinking that the promise found there is applicable to us. This was a promise given by God through Moses to Joshua, the one to lead the people of God into the “Promised Land.” Considering this promise, I see a parallel of that Bible moment for Joshua which is like the graduation moment for us at USA. Stick with me and read on, I will explain.

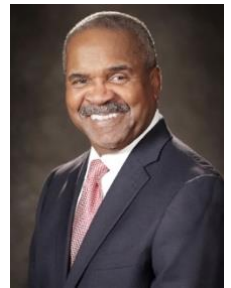
Now, I am not saying that you and I were a Joshua back in the day. Not even close, but Joshua's moment represented a graduation for him. He had matriculated through the school of “Wilderness Academy” for 40 years. He was taught a lot of things academic, spiritual, and practical to help prepare him for this launch. He had encountered daily the ways of Moses, one of the greatest influencers on record. He observed up close and personally what leadership should look like. He recognized the attention to detail that is needed to prepare for the future. He understood the fortitude and resolve required to work with people who were prone to always challenge leadership.

I took from USA those broad themes that have helped me experience what I consider to be a modicum of success. During my matriculation at USA, I observed examples of what good leadership should be. I recognized the importance of attending to the details of life. I understood that working with people, especially God's people, would require resolve and patience. I believe from that day in 1974, and through these experiences, God was speaking to me, whether I realized it or not, and He would be with me no matter what. *“He would never leave me or forsake me.”*

Over the past 50 years, I have fallen short of some things, and I have accomplished some things. I am okay with that because He has stood by His promise, during the difficulties, to never leave me or forsake me. I have had cancer. I have had heart bypass surgery. My wife of 45 years and I have lost infant children. Through all of this, He has never left me or forsaken me. At the same time, I have achieved higher academic degrees. I have ascended from teaching in the classroom to leading at the executive level of education administration. He has never left me or forsaken me. There were times when I chose to leave and forsake Him, but He stayed right there by me until I figured out that His way is best.

Classmates and friends, as we approach the upcoming alumni weekend, reflect on the goodness of God and how He has stuck with you every step of the way, even if you did not realize it. He has never left you or forsaken you. That is what I will bring with me as we reminisce. Hey, I look forward to seeing you this September 20 to 22, 2024, at our USA alma mater, near the “shores of Lake Cayuga where the rippling waters play....”

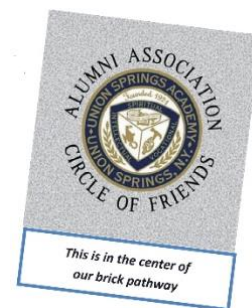

Miracles Along the Way

This one happened at USA. My son, Ronald, was a student at USA 1988-1989. Born with a hearing deficit, he wore hearing aids from the age of six. We chained them, glued them, all but welded them to his frail little body. As responsible as he was, we experienced a couple of close calls. Riding a horse in a thirty-acre field, he lost a hearing aid. Some would call it a coincidence that we found that hearing aid. Our family considers it a *miracle*. That experience was not nearly as impressive as what Ronald encountered one morning in the boy's dorm at USA. He could not find one of his hearing aids. He called home a bit concerned, and I got on the phone with John Foote, '68, the boys dean at the time. They had already searched Ron's room and all of the places he had been that morning. John said, "I'm going to go out and look in the dumpster. Who knows?" John said, "I'll go look." The story could stop right here. I choke up when I think of John Foote.

Knowing we serve a God who cares about hearing aids because without them, quality of life was significantly impeded for Ron. Knowing we serve a God who 11 years earlier put a man at USA who would care enough to get into a dumpster and look for a hearing aid for one of the boys. Knowing we serve a God who performs *miracles*.

Yes, he found that hearing aid in a dumpster full of a week's worth of garbage. And thirty years later I saw John Foote at Camp Meeting. The first thing I said was, "John, the hearing aid." He said, "I know."

Miracles.
