Pastor's Corner: Devotional

"Encouragement"

The situation of Christians in Jerusalem was dire after the crucifixion of Jesus The Jewish leaders there had joined with the Romans in an outbreak of persecution. To accept the risen Jesus for these early believers in Jerusalem meant being ostracized from society, their families, and their jobs. All visible sources of sustenance and support were denied them if they made the decision to follow Jesus. Yet, they were convicted by the Spirit that had been poured out at Pentecost. Many could not deny their convictions and boldly accepted Christ at the risk of poverty, abandonment by their families, and possible death. It was both a wonderful and terrible time combined. There was a serious danger that the early movement of the Spirit would be quashed thru discouragement.

At this critical time when all was on the line and the early Christians were in danger of being overcome and overwhelmed, God used Joseph of Cyprus, a Levite, not one of the better known names in the New Testament. Joseph saw what was happening, he saw the great needs of the early believers who were being rejected by their families and losing visible means of support. To meet this crisis and change history, Joseph did the unthinkable. He sold a very valuable piece of land that he owned and gave the proceedings to take care of the early Christians who had lost everything to follow Jesus. His generous gift made an incredible difference to the fragile fledgling body of Christ as well as giving an example of brotherly love to them which became contagious, therefore, this early crisis in the burgeoning church was averted.

Joseph of Cypress makes another appearance in the NT when he took Paul under his wing. Saul (later Paul) had engineered much of the persecution in Jerusalem against the early Christians and those traumatized believers wanted nothing to do with him. After his conversion Paul went to Jerusalem to unite with the church there, but the Christian leadership, understandably, were not ready to trust him. Joseph extended grace and friendship to Paul when no one else did, and thereby helped facilitate the process of the church embracing Paul as an apostle of Jesus Christ.

The days we live in are tough times for many of us. The pandemic has ravaged our country, our churches, some of our families. Many of us and our family members and friends have lost their jobs, health. and our childrens' schools are anything but normal. If that were not enough, divisions in our country have been exacerbated and we, at times, find ourselves to be at war with ourselves, or with our loved ones. We may feel discouraged and possibly lacking in belief and hope for the future.


The end to the above story is fascinating! Read on... Joseph of Cypress is really Barnabas. Barnabas means "Son of Encouragement"! [Read Acts 4:36] It seems Joseph was subsequently re-named Barnabas because of what he did for both the early church and the Apostle Paul. Joseph/Barnabas, through the Holy Spirit, changed history by his acts of encouragement. What a difference. Prayer: "Lord, raise up another Barnabas or hundreds of people like Barnabas to encourage us in this difficult time. Please use us as "SONS and DAUGHTERS of ENCOURAGEMENT!"



The Pathway Home!

Just as the "Roaring Twenties" were about to break over the United States, early Adventists were struggling to provide Christian education for New York's youth. Schools were started earlier in Western and Eastern New York Conferences, but

both met difficulties. In his book, "Where the Pine Trees Softly Whisper", Dr. Brian Strayer providés a thorough history of those early challenges. Through providence and hard work these two faithful Adventist entities decided to combine resources and situate a new Adventist school somewhere between their geographic areas. At the same time these Adventists schools were struggling, a Quaker



school in the small village of Union Springs, New York had a fire and closed. A prominent church member was led to discover that this large, three-story brick building in Union Springs was available and could be renovated for the new Adventist school. Thus, in September 1921 Union Springs Academy was born.

I wonder what those church pioneers thought or hoped USA would become for the youth of New York. Did they speculate that USA would exist in 100 years? Probably they would be disappointed, as they hoped Christ would have come long before 2021. But on the other hand, maybe they would be proud that as the decades passed, the school would grow and more seeds of the gospel were planted in young minds.

Now it is 2021, and we are celebrating God's blessing of 100 years for USA. With awe, humble hearts, and maybe some pride, we look back over decades of success and sacrifice. Most of you reading this have attended USA or have family and friends who did. Do you smile as you remember people and events that are linked to this place? Ever wonder how your life would have been different had you gone to some other school? What doors did USA open or close for you? Can we say that we found God's presence at USA among it's students, teachers and grounds? These are obviously personal questions, but common to more than 4,000 alumni scattered over the globe. This collection of old buildings located on a hill facing those beautiful sunsets has changed many lives. Please offer a prayer of thanks for the heartfelt sacrifices of those people who bought this place, built it, maintained it, staffed it, and continue to do so. No matter where life has taken you, Union Springs Academy is part of you. So come back and join the USA family in praising God for his blessings at the Centennial Celebration: September 17-19, 2021.
